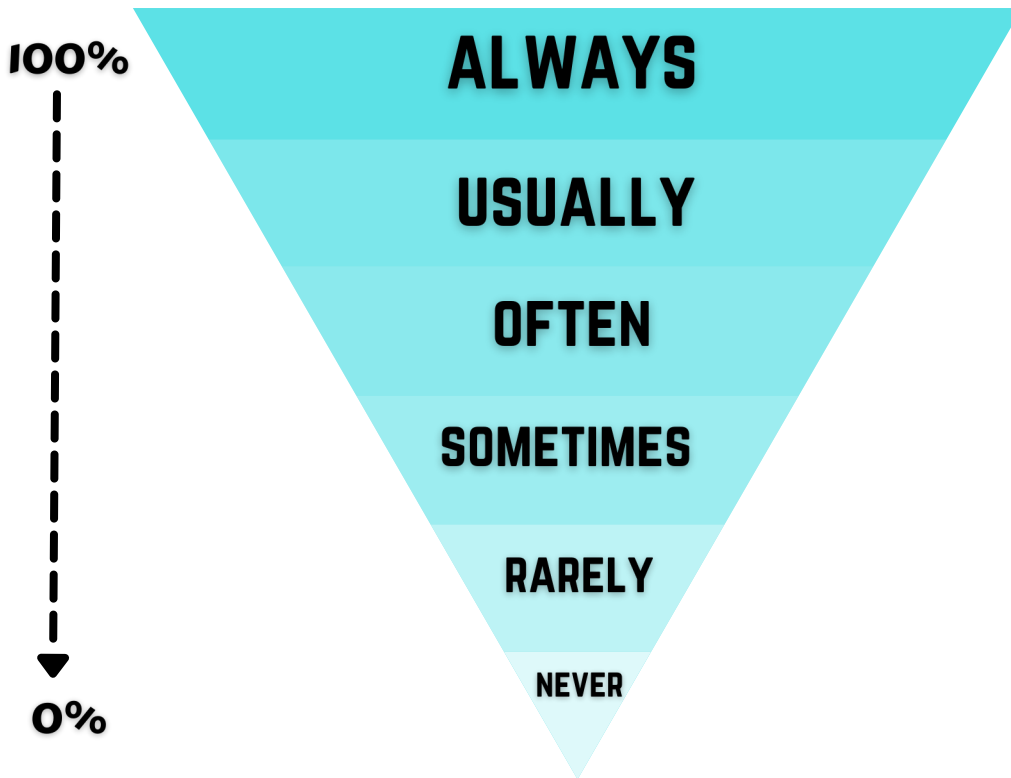


FREQUENCY ADVERBS

*Study the adverbs of frequency below.

*Pay attention to the position of these adverbs in the sentence.



Position of frequency adverbs:

Affirmative	Mike usually walks to work.	before the main verb
	John is never late for work.	after the verb to be
Negative	James doesn't usually drive.	after the auxiliary (don't/doesn't)
	Lois isn't often late for work.	after the verb to be (negative)

Questions

Does Mike **usually** walk to work?

Is **Louis** **sometimes** late for work?
